### About the unit

The Chemotherapy Unit is located immediately behind the Dialysis Unit. Access to the Unit from the Splatt Street entrance can be made simply by progressing down the main corridor of the Hospital and following the signs.

#### STAFFING OF THE UNIT

The Unit is staffed by Nurses, who have undergone <u>specialised training</u> in the administration of chemotherapy. They are a group of dedicated and caring professionals committed to providing the best possible care for our patients. They will assist you with your treatments.

#### **CONTACTING THE SERVICE**

Clients can contact the Chemotherapy Service during our normal opening hours, Tuesday—Friday, 7:30 am - 4.00 p.m.

## What to expect

#### **Chemotherapy Treatment**

On the day of your treatment, you can have your usual breakfast and any medication that you usually take unless advised by the Oncologist.

Your chemotherapy will usually be given in the morning, the length of time to administer will depend on your treatment plan as ordered by your oncologist.

You will have a blood test before each course of treatment commences, to check your blood levels. Treatments are usually given by intravenous drip into your vein or you may have had a port or PICC line inserted prior to treatment.

The nurses will explain any possible side effects and how to manage them. The Doctor will provide you with any prescriptions you may need for medication to reduce side effects from your treatment. Please tell us about all tablets including vitamins and natural therapies you maybe taking.

You must be careful with your hygiene and protect yourself from any infections. Please avoid people that are unwell.

If you have a temperature above <u>38 DEGREES</u> celsius or feel unwell contact the emergency department immediately for advice.

#### **PARKING**

Parking is available in High Street. On Street parking is available around the Hospital, however, time limits do apply.

#### **Oncologist Visits**

Visiting oncologist operate out of 28 High Street once per month along with Telehealth being provided at 60 McRae street, for clients each week.

# Before you leave the Chemotherapy unit

Before you leave the Chemotherapy Unit you need to arrange with the Nurse;

- Your next appointment date and time
- When any tests are due

Some tests may need to be completed between your visits to the Chemotherapy Service.
