What is Palliative Care?

Palliative care is specialised care and support provided for someone living with a life threatening or life limiting illness. This means if you have a diagnosis where cure may not be possible or you think you may not live as long as you had intended.

Importantly, palliative care also involves care and support for family and caregivers.

The goal of palliative care is to improve quality of life for clients, their families and caregivers by providing care that addresses the many needs clients, families and caregivers have: physical (including treatment of pain and other symptoms), emotional, social, cultural and spiritual.

Palliative care aims to help the client live as well as possible.

Palliative care offers support to help family and caregivers manage during the client's illness and in bereavement.

What Is Specialist Palliative Care?

A small number of people experience severe or complex problems as their condition advances.

These people may be referred to Swan Hill Community Palliative Care where the team of health professionals will work together to meet their needs, liaising with appropriate specialists.

Treatment aimed at curing illness can often be continued whilst on palliative care.

The focus of care is maintaining quality of life and meeting the needs of the person, their family and carers.

Free support to all people living with a life threatening or life limiting illness

Referral to Palliative Care

Referrals are welcome from clients directly, from family members or from health service providers.

If the referral is coming from family, palliative care will liaise with the client and the client's GP to ensure the appropriate provision of care is provided.

The client requiring care must be aware of and consent to the referral.
