

Diabetes Educators can assist those with diabetes to learn about the disease, how to prevent or delay complications, how to check their blood glucose levels, and about their diabetes medicines. A Credentialed Diabetes Educator is qualified to provide clients with consistent high quality diabetes education and care.

Professional Continuous Glucose Monitoring

(CGM)- iPro© 2 A small lightweight device that takes your glucose reading every 5 minutes. Wear it for 6 days for a more complete picture of your glucose levels. Learn how meals, daily activity and sleep can change your levels.

Endocrinology Service: For people living with Type 1 and Type 2 diabetes

This diabetes specialist service is in partnership with The Royal Flying Doctors Telehealth Service and Baker IDI Heart and Diabetes Institute.
