The Community Health team are excited to announce the expansion of our Sexual & Reproductive Health Service with the appointment of an additional Nurse Practitioner to provide one day per week with the option of extra days to cover leave. This position is located within the Sexual & Reproductive Health team at Community Health, based at 125 Campbell Street, Swan Hill. Relevant qualifications are required, as per position description.

The Sexual and Reproductive Health Nurse Practitioner will provide services within the Sexual & Reproductive Health Clinic. Services will include comprehensive sexual & reproductive health assessment and screening, physical health assessment as required, treatment, education and support, and referral as required, to adults and young people in matters relating to sexual & reproductive health (including pregnancy choices). This position requires additional qualifications in sexual and reproductive health as per position description.

The Community Health team works closely with Departments within the Community Care Division and the broader health service, along with a range of local and statewide organisations and our community.

The successful applicant must provide:
