Is there any cost?

There is no cost for the **HARP** program.

However, you may incur fees if you require aids or equipment, or if the HARP program transfers your care to other services that charge fees.

This will be discussed with you prior.

How do I get a referral?

You can be referred to HARP by:

- Any healthcare worker you are involved with (at the hospital or in the community)
- Your GP
- Your family or friends

You can even refer yourself

You may be eligible for our **Hospital Admission Risk Program** (*HARP*). This is a no-cost, community support program based at Swan Hill District Health.

HARP aims to improve the health experience and quality of life for people who are living with chronic and/or complex heath issues.

Care is provided by Care Coordinators who have a nursing or other health related qualifications. Support can be provided via home visits or by telephone.

What can HARP do for me?

Your Care Coordinator will undertake a thorough assessment to determine your needs, and will work with you to create a 'care plan' that clearly describes the services that would benefit you.

HARP can help by:

- Providing education to help you manage your condition and/or medications
- Coordinating appointments with specialists, GPs, and other health professionals
- Providing emotional support
- Linking you in with support and community health services
- Assist in preventing unplanned hospital admissions
